### FReDA – The German Family Demography Panel Study

provides data on over 30,000 individuals in Germany. This new study collects data on:



Family, parent-child and generational relationships



Partnerships and private lifestyles



Division of work in a partnership



Life satisfaction



Desires to have children and family planning



Education and work

Sign-up for the 3-day FReDA/GGS Autumn School to learn how to use the FReDA dataset as well as the Generations and Gender Survey (GGS). Participants will be introduced to FReDA and GGS, find out how to access the data, and will have the chance to work with the data through hands-on sessions.

As a panel study, FReDA collects data about living situations of partnerships and families in Germany over a prolonged and continuous period of time. A representative sample was drawn from all people aged 18 to 49 living in Germany in 2020. Twice a year, FReDA surveys its participants and their partners. The GGS is a survey on life-course and family dynamics across various counries. It surveys people aged 18 to 79, with follow-up surveys at three and six-year intervals.

#### >> KEY ELEMENTS OF FREDA and GGS

- Large sample size: The FReDA panel collects about 30,000 interviews twice a year and there are already 7 sub-waves available.
- Multi-actor design: Partners of the anchor sample are also surveyed.
- **Cross-national comparison**: FReDA participates in the Generations and Gender Survey (GGS), which allows users to compare the data with many other European and non- European countries.
- **Open modules:** Researchers have the opportunity to submit questions to be included in the FReDA questionnaire, expanding the scope of the survey.
